## OUR APPROACH

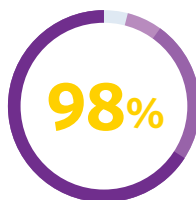

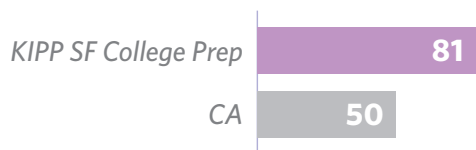

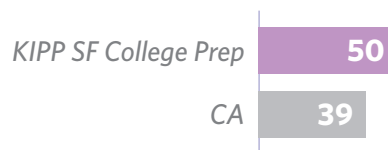

*% of students meeting or exceeding standards in Math\**

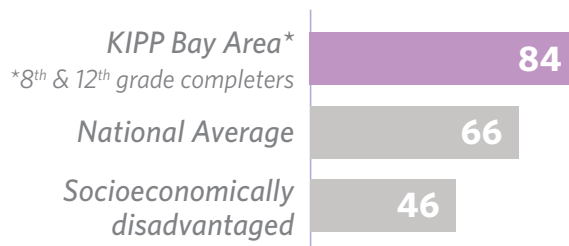
